Trussell Update

We need urgent action on hunger in the UK. People are being pushed to the brink because they don't have enough money to live on. This can't go on.

We are 1,400 food bank locations, supported by 36,000 volunteers, 12,000 churches, 100,000s of community groups and schools, and millions of people around the UK.

We work locally and across the UK for a more just and compassionate society where no one needs a food bank to survive. We're determined to make this a reality.

Until this happens, we provide emergency food and practical support to people in their hardest moments. And work with our partners and local communities to ensure everyone gets the right help long before they need to use a food bank.

Recent EGFB Statistics Snapshot

We helped the following total annual numbers of clients:

- · 2024 1,616 Adults and 1,010 Children Total 2,626
- · 2023 1,981 Adults and 1,203 Children Total 3,184

These numbers are total visits rather than individuals, so one client coming three times would contribute 3 to the totals.

We feel that these falling numbers, both in the annual totals and in each of the last 3 months of the year compared to 2023, indicate success in the Financial Inclusion and other support offers in reducing the need for clients to keep coming; but we need more evidence to support this, so we intend to develop reports combining the financial value of food and other support (gift cards and vouchers).

A Message from our Trustees



We have now completed our transformation, and the East Grinstead is now running as a **Charitable Incorporated Organisation, CIO** (number 1208343 at the Charities Commission). This has had minimal impact on how we operate but required a lot of effort behind the scenes and special thanks must go to Philip Brown, our Finance Trustee, for his herculean efforts at managing the bureaucratic processes.

With the conversion complete, the Trustees look forward to fresh challenges in 2025, working with the team on securing the future of the Financial Inclusion project, gathering more lived experience feedback and working with other agencies to move further on our Mission to ensure no one needs a Food Bank to survive.

Christmas Bag Pack

A really big thank you to all our wonderful volunteers, including the Town Mayor Steve Odie for packing 200 double Christmas bags and delivering them. Thank you also to all those who donated their time, money and food to help us deliver this much needed support at Christmas. This represents approximately 1970 kgs of food going out to those in need.

In a new initiative, we ran a "Santa's Grotto" in a separate room in the sessions before Christmas, with a display of soft toys and Christmas treats. Thanks to Corina for sourcing the soft toys and to all the volunteers who managed this room.

As well as the Grotto, we were able to pass 50 soft toys to Being Neighbourly for their "Christmas Smiles" deliveries to locally isolated people and another 50 were driven to children in war-torn Ukraine.



The Christmas Bag Pack represents one of the biggest events in our calendar. As well as the central provision of food and goodwill, it provides an opportunity for our volunteers to work together in a larger group, for outside supporters to 'muck in' and for general publicity.

It requires a huge amount of food and Christmas items and of effort from the warehouse and delivery teams.

There will be a full de-briefing shortly and any thoughts on the Bag Pack (aims, processes, set up and all) would be most welcome – please let Mike Barlow or Lucy Tribe have your thoughts.


Thank you to all our Sains bury's and Waitrose customers who have donated food and money to the Foodbank, we are incredibly grateful for your support.
